Activities whose proponents have identified or secured private and non-federal public funding sources are given extra consideration during the grant allocation process. Private, not-for-profit organization administrators are actively encouraged to search out such funding sources in order to ensure the long-term sustainability of their organizations. Program administrators are also encouraged to cite the award of CDBG, HOME, or ESG funds when submitting applications for private and non-federal public grant funding.

Recipients of CDBG, HOME, and ESG funds are required to report the source(s) and amount(s) of all other funding sources, which contributed to a specific activity. Some specific examples of other funding sources include: in-kind contributions; foundation grants; individual contributions and donations; private capital loans and grants; and private equity investments.

Planned Activities

Activities are anticipated to include eviction and foreclosure prevention activities to expand the capacity of existing programs:

- Up to \$520,000 to be allocated to a local non-profit organizations experienced in and prepared to immediately undertake foreclosure prevention activities for City of Racine homeowners
- Up to \$120,000 to be allocated to partner agencies in the Homelessness and Housing Alliance/Racine Continuum of Care for direct assistance to City of Racine tenants to prevent evictions
- Up to \$342,617 will be allocated to eligible entities for eviction prevention programs, foreclosure prevention programs, or other eligible activities to prepare for, prevent, or respond to Coronavirus
