for

### Concrete Curb Installation - Horlick Athletic Field Baseball Diamond

## <u>DIVISION I</u> GENERAL CONDITIONS

### A. Scope

Contractor shall, for the bid price given, furnish all materials, labor, tools and equipment and perform all necessary work to ensure proper completion of the bid items listed on the Bidder's Proposal for the removal and replacement of concrete at various locations.

### 1. Synthetic Turf Concrete Curb Project Overview:

Concrete contractor shall install concrete curbs for the installation of synthetic turf for the Horlick Field Baseball Diamond. Fence contractor will remove line fences along 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> bases, the existing backstop will remain with the lower portion of the fabric removed. With the exception of fencing, all demolition required for concrete curb installation shall be completed by concrete installer. Approximately a 20 foot section of curb will not be installed until excavation contractor completes removal of turf from existing infield. Project coordination with other contractors on the projects will be crucial to project completion. Refer to plans and specifications for further details.

### 2. Construction Notes:

- a. Concrete Contractor shall coordinate with Project Manager, Fence Contractor and Excavator for installation of the concrete curb.
- b. Project Manager will set grades and monitor grades throughout project.
- c. Contractor shall coordinate location for 20' curb opening for turf removal.
- d. Concrete curb installation will be top priority followed by fence line post installation.
- e. Line fence & chainlink fabric removal and replacement by others 4" posts for backstop will remain.
- f. Spoils from concrete curb installation will remain on site.
- g. Concrete or asphalt removed must be removed by concrete curb contractor.

### 3. Scope of Work:

- a. Sawcut asphalt as indicated on plans, remove as required.
- b. Excavate as required per plans and specifications for form installation. Removal of concrete for placement of curb forms is included in the project scope.
- c. Contractor must coordinate with fence contractor to install line posts after forms are in place before pouring concrete.
- d. Add rebar per plans and specifications.
- e. Pour and finish curbs per plans and specifications.
- f. Pour slabs per plans and specifications.
- g. Install curb in open section.
- h. Remove forms and clean-up.

### B. Location

The work under this contract shall be performed at: Horlick Athletic Field Baseball Diamond – 1648 N. Memorial Drive, Racine; Wisconsin.

### C. <u>Inspection of Site</u>

- 1. Contractors shall visit the site to determine the exact conditions that exist relative to the services called for under these specifications.

### D. Quantities

The quantities for the items listed on the Bidder's Proposal shall be considered approximate and the Parks Department reserves the right to increase or decrease quantities stated to stay within the limits of the established project budget.

### E. General

- 1. Contractor shall secure all permits and pay all fees required for the work under this contract.
- 2. Contractor shall protect and maintain all existing conduits, cables, wires, sewers, pipes, structures, etc. and repair any item that is damaged or disturbed, at Contractor's expense.
- 3. Contractor shall take all necessary precautions to protect all existing vegetation. Any trees, shrubs and/or lawn areas that are damaged by the Contractor shall be replaced and/or restored, at Contractor's expense.
- 4. Contractor shall visit the project site, appraise the existing conditions and determine the requirements under which the work shall be performed.
- 5. Contractor shall notify DIGGERS HOTLINE prior to any excavation. Contractor shall not proceed until all utilities have been located and marked.
- 6. Contractor shall notify the Parks Department 262-636-9135 three (3) working days prior to any excavation in order that all private park utility lines can be located. Contractor shall not proceed until such lines have been located and marked.
- 7. Within fifteen (15) days following receipt of the Purchase Order, the Contractor shall establish a construction schedule which describes the stages of work under the contract and the anticipated inclusive dates of each stage.

## <u>DIVISION II</u> MATERIALS AND INSTALLATION

### A. Standards

- 1. The work hereunder shall be performed in a thorough, workmanlike manner in conformance with the accepted methods and practices of each trade and in strict compliance with all applicable sections of the City of Racine Municipal Codes, the State of Wisconsin Standards Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, the American Society for Testing and Materials or any other applicable code, standard or order as if such legal requirements were herein set forth in length. Any reference to the above mentioned codes or standards shall refer to the most recent or latest specification or designation.
- 2. Where names of specific products are designated in these specifications or in the details appearing on the plans, the intent is to state the general type and quality of the product desired without ruling out use of other products of equal type and quality provided that use of other products of equal type and quality has been approved in writing by the Parks Department five (5) working days prior to the due date.

### 3. Work Included

- a. Demo and removal of existing asphalt and concrete per plans and specifications.
- b. Haul asphalt and concrete spoils offsite.
- c. Install concrete curb & flatwork per plans.
- d. Leave curb opening for excavation contractor install curb when directed by Project Manager.

### 4. Related Work

a. Remove all concrete & asphalt spoils from concrete curb installation.

### 5. Work Not Included – Work By Others

- a. Opening area of chainlink fence for construction entrance.
- b. Excavation for fence installation.
- c. Asphalt Replacement except were being replaced with concrete curb.
- d. Concrete replacement not related to sewer installation.
- e. Installation of fence.
- f. Irrigation repairs or replacement.
- g. Installation of Synthetic Turf.

### 6. Utilities

Note: Contractor is responsible to call Digger's Hotline and Owner Representative to mark utilities.

### 1. Project Area:

- a. Electric Private Underground See Plans.
- b. Water & Irrigation See Plans.
- c. Storm Sewer See Plans.
- d. Gas Underground, Call Digger's Hotline
- e. Communications None in project area.

### B. Concrete Removal & Replacement

Concrete sidewalk removal and replacement shall be subject to the applicable provisions of the State Specifications. Removal and replacement of concrete sidewalk shall be measured in square feet.

### C. Sawcuts

All sawcuts shall be full depth.

### D. Trees & Roots

Roots of trees may be cut to a maximum depth of twelve (12) inches. The roots shall clear the new work by a minimum of two (2) inches.

### E. Formwork

Forms shall be constructed with exactness, holding to accurate dimensions. Formwork should be rigid and sufficiently strong to support the weight of the concrete without deformation.

1. Fence contractor will be installing line fence inside open forms before pouring. Contractor must contact Project Manager to set up line post installation.

### F. Subgrade

All concrete work shall be built on a thoroughly <u>compacted</u>, solid ground surface. If the excavation is carried below subgrade elevation, the proper elevation shall be obtained by backfilling with approved sand-gravel fill or limestone screenings compacted in place by mechanical compaction.

### G. Crushed Aggregate Base

All concrete sidewalk work shall be <u>compacted</u> sand-gravel fill or limestone screening base course. See details in specifications.

### H. Expansion & Control Joints

- 1. A one-half (1/2)-inch thick expansion filler, by the width and depth of the sidewalk, shall be placed at not more than forty (40) foot intervals. Filler shall also be placed where sidewalk work abuts curb and gutter, buildings, fixed objects and at all locations where the abutting sidewalk contains longitudinal cracks, which could continue into new work constructed under this contract. Any expansion joints needed to accommodate special circumstances encountered during construction shall be placed at the Parks Department direction. All expansion joints shall be placed perpendicular to the direction and grade of the sidewalk.
  - A one-half (1/2) inch thick expansion filler, matching the cross section of the curb and gutter, shall be placed in the curb and gutter at both ends of each removal and replacement section.
- 2. All control joints shall be spaced to match existing joint spacing. The spacing of control joints for curb and gutter shall not be more than ten (10) feet.

### I. Concrete Pavement & Curbs

- 1. All sidewalks shall consist of one (1) course, air-entrained Portland cement concrete. The concrete shall contain six (6) bags of cement per cubic yard of concrete and the water content shall not exceed six (6) gallons of water per sack of cement.
- 2. Contractor shall protect all curing concrete, which is likely to be exposed to air temperatures of less than forty (40°F) degrees, with adequate covering and heat. No concrete shall be placed upon a frozen subgrade or one that contains frozen materials. All concrete damaged by freezing, snow, heat, water or any other causes shall be made good by the Contractor.
- 3. Contractor shall be responsible for providing supervision of all curing concrete to minimize any vandalism. All concrete damaged by vandalism shall be made good by the Contractor, at Contractor's expense.

### J. Concrete Reinforcement

- 1. Rebar and other concrete reinforcement shall be added per specifications.
- 2. Contractor shall contact Project Manager for inspection before pouring concrete.
- 3. Rebar or reinforcement that may interfere with fence line post shall be adjusted per Project Manager's direction.

### K. Curing Compound

Curing compound shall be sprayed on the freshly placed concrete surface to prevent moisture evaporation.

### L. Incidental Adjustments

Contractor is required to make all slight adjustments of stop boxes or other obstructions that is incidental to the concrete work at no additional cost to the City of Racine.

### M. Backfilling

All areas adjacent to sidewalk and/or curb and gutter construction shall be backfilled with screened topsoil and meet the requirements of the applicable provisions of the State Specifications. If an area of sod is removed over and above that necessary to place the form, it will be the Contractor's responsibility to re-sod that area at no additional cost to the City of Racine.

### N. Barricades

Contractor shall furnish, erect and maintain at all times during construction all necessary signs, lights, barricades and warning devices required to protect the general public, Contractor's employees and the work itself. All barricades shall conform to the appropriate section of the latest edition of the "Traffic Controls for Street Construction and Maintenance Operations" manual, published by the Commissioner of Public Works. A copy of this manual is on file in the Department of Public Works.

### O. Haul Routes & Excavated Materials

- 1. The Parks Department reserves the right to direct the Contractor as to the routes to be used for hauling of excavated materials from the project site and new materials to the site.
- 2. Dump site for spoils is approximately .46 miles from project location 1425 N. Memorial Drive.
- 3. **Dump site note**: ONLY materials excavated from the Horlick Athletic Field may be dumped at the designated site No Exceptions!
- 4. All <u>"non-turf"</u> excavated materials shall become the property of the Contractor and shall be disposed of at contractor's expense.
- 5. All excavated materials shall become the property of the Contractor and shall be disposed of at Contractor's expense.

### P. Quality Assurance & Standards

The Contractor shall employ adequate numbers of experienced, skilled tradesmen for the work, who are familiar with all the methods, materials, requirements and their standards needed for the proper performance of the work specified and in accordance with best industry standards.

### Q. Special Circumstances

- 1. Football portion of Horlick Athletic Field will be open for afternoon football games. Contractor shall ensure project related equipment and vehicles stay within designated project boundaries.
- 2. Contractor shall limit all vehicles to project area.

# DIVISION III FINAL INSPECTION AND CLEANUP

### A. Standards

- 1. Any existing structure, damaged or disturbed during the course of construction of any phase of this contract, shall be repaired by the Contractor at his own expense. This includes any sawcuts needed, as determined by the Parks Department, to straighten any irregular edges of the damaged structure(s).
- 2. All refuse associated with any construction phase of this contract shall be immediately cleaned up and removed by the Contractor's expense.

DIVISION IV TIME LIMIT

### A. Standards

- 1. Work under this contract shall be completed between August 19<sup>th</sup> thru August 30<sup>th</sup>, 2019.
- 2. Contractor shall contact Owner Representation and Project Manager if weather conditions prevent completion of project within designated time frame.

### DIVISION V GUARANTEE

Contractor shall agree and guarantee that the materials, equipment and workmanship supplied by him shall be free from all defects and strictly in accordance with the specifications at the time of its completion and acceptance by the City of Racine and for a period of one (1) year thereafter; and in case of any cracks, leaks or settlement or any other defects as to materials, equipment or workmanship existing or appearing in any part of the work constructed by him within one (1) year thereafter, the Contractor agrees to forthwith repair the same upon notification by the City using the same materials required by this specification and in case the Contractor shall fail to make such repairs; the Contractor further agrees and guarantees to pay for all labor and material used in or about the construction of said work in his contract which may become a lien or a claim against the City. Such agreement and guarantee shall be made a part of the contract and the fulfillment thereof shall be secured by the bond of the Contractor.

### DIVISION VI INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE

To the fullest extent allowable by law, Contractor hereby indemnifies and shall defend and hold harmless the City of Racine, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees or authorized representatives or volunteers and each of them from and against any and all suits, actions, legal or administrative proceedings, claims, demands, damages, liabilities, interest, attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses of whatsoever kind or nature whether arising before, during, or after completion of the work hereunder and in any manner directly or indirectly caused, occasioned, or contributed to in whole or in part or claimed to be caused, occasioned, or contributed to in whole or in part, by reason of any act, omission, fault, or negligence, whether active or passive, of Contractor or of anyone acting under its direction or control or on its behalf in connection with or incident to the performance of this Agreement regardless if liability without fault is sought to be imposed on the City of Racine, Contractor's aforesaid indemnity and hold harmless agreement shall not be applicable to any liability caused by the sole fault, sole negligence, or willful misconduct of the City of Racine, or its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees or authorized representatives or volunteers. This indemnity provision shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

In any and all claims against the City of Racine, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees or authorized representatives or volunteers by an employee of Contractor, any subcontractor, or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, the indemnification obligation under this paragraph shall not be limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages, compensation, or benefits payable by or for the Contractor or any subcontractor under Worker's Compensation Acts, Disability Benefit Acts, or other employee benefit acts.

No provision of this Indemnification clause shall give rise to any duties not otherwise provided for by this Agreement or by operation of law. No provision of this Indemnity clause shall be construed to negate, abridge, or otherwise reduce any other right or obligation of indemnity that would otherwise exist as to the City of Racine, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees or authorized representatives or volunteers under this or any other contract. This clause is to be read in conjunction with all other indemnity provisions contained in this Agreement. Any conflict or ambiguity arising between any indemnity provisions in this Agreement shall be construed in favor of indemnified parties except when such interpretation would violate the laws of the state in which the job site is located. Contractor shall reimburse the City of Racine, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees or authorized representatives or volunteers for any and all legal expenses and costs incurred by each of them in connection therewith or in enforcing the indemnity herein provided. Contractor's obligation to indemnify shall not be restricted to

insurance proceeds, if any, received by the City of Racine, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees or authorized representatives or volunteers.

### **Insurance Requirements**

The Contractor shall not commence work under a contract until he has obtained all insurance required under this paragraph and has filed certificates thereof with the Owner, nor shall the Contractor allow a Subcontractor to commence work until all similar insurance required has been so obtained and filed with the Contractor. Unless otherwise specified in this Agreement, the Contractor shall, at its sole expense, maintain in effect at all times during the performance of the Work, insurance coverage with limits not less than those set forth below with insurers and under forms of policies set forth below.

Worker's Compensation and Employers Liability Insurance - The Contractor shall cover or insure under the applicable labor laws relating to worker's compensation insurance, all of their employees in accordance with the law in the State of Wisconsin. The Contractor shall provide statutory coverage for work related injuries and employer's liability insurance with limits of \$1,000,000 each accident, \$1,000,000 disease policy limit, and \$1,000,000 disease each employee.

Commercial General liability and Automobile Liability Insurance - The Contractor shall provide and maintain the following commercial general liability and automobile liability insurance:

Coverage – Coverage for commercial general liability and automobile liability insurance shall be at least as broad as the following:

- 1. Insurance Services Office (ISO) Commercial General Liability Coverage (Occurrence Form CG0001)
- 2. Insurance Services Office (ISO) Business Auto Coverage (Form CA0001), covering Symbol 1 (any vehicle)

Limits -The Contractor shall maintain limits no less than the following:

- 1. General Liability One million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence (\$2,000,000 general aggregate if applicable) for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. If Commercial General Liability Insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to the project/location (with the ISO CG 2503, or ISO CG 2504, or insurer's equivalent endorsement provided to the City of Racine) or the general aggregate including product-completed operations aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
- 2. Automobile Liability- One million dollars (\$1,000,000) for bodily injury and property damage per occurrence limit covering all vehicles to be used in relationship to the Agreement.
- 3. Umbrella Liability- One Million dollars (\$1,000,000) for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage per occurrence in excess of coverage carried for Employers' Liability, Commercial General Liability and Automobile Liability as described above.

Required Provisions - The general liability and automobile liability policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

1. The City of Racine, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees or authorized representatives or volunteers are to be given additional insured status as respects liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Contractor; on products and completed operations of the Contractor; for

premises occupied or used by the Contractor; and on any vehicles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by the Contractor.

- 2. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the City of Racine, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees or authorized representatives or volunteers.
- 3. For any claims related to this project, the Contractor's insurance shall be primary insurance as respects the City of Racine, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees or authorized representatives or volunteers. Any insurance, self-insurance, or other coverage maintained by the City of Racine, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees, or authorized representatives or volunteers shall not contribute to it.
- 4. Any failure to comply with reporting or other provisions of the policies including breaches of warranties shall not affect coverage provided to the City of Racine, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees or authorized representatives or volunteers.
- 5. The Contractor's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- 6. Each insurance policy required by this agreement shall state, or be endorsed to state, that coverage shall not be canceled by the insurance carrier or the Contractor, except after sixty (60) days (or 10 days for non-payment of premium) prior written notice by U.S. mail has been given to the City of Racine.
- 7. Such liability insurance shall indemnify the City of Racine, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees or authorized representatives or volunteers against loss from liability imposed by law upon, or assumed under contract by, the Contractor for damages on account of such bodily injury (including death), property damage, personal injury, completed operations, and products liability.
- 8. The general liability policy shall cover bodily injury and property damage liability, owned and non-owned equipment, blanket contractual liability, completed operations liability with a minimum of a 24 month policy extension, explosion, collapse, underground excavation, and removal of lateral support, and shall not contain an exclusion for what is commonly referred to by the insurers as the "XCU" hazards. The automobile liability policy shall cover all owned, non-owned, and hired vehicles. All of the insurance shall be provided on policy forms and through companies satisfactory to the City of Racine, and shall have a minimum A.M. Best's rating of A-VII.

Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions - Any deductible or self-insured retention must be declared to and approved by the City of Racine. At the option of the City of Racine, the insurer shall either reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions.

Evidences of Insurance - Prior to execution of the agreement, the Contractor shall file with the City of Racine a certificate of insurance (Acord Form 25-S or equivalent) signed by the insurer's representative evidencing the coverage required by this agreement. Such evidence shall include an additional insured endorsement signed by the insurer's representative. Such evidence shall also include confirmation that coverage includes or has been modified to include all required provisions 1-8.

Responsibility for Work - Until the completion and final acceptance by the City of Racine of all the work under and implied by this agreement, the work shall be under the Contractor's responsibility care and control. The Contractor shall rebuild, repair, restore and make good all injuries, damages, re-erections, and repairs occasioned or rendered necessary by causes of any nature whatsoever.

Sub-Contractors - In the event that the Contractor employs other contractors (subcontractors) as part of the work covered by this agreement, it shall be the Contractor's responsibility to require and confirm that each sub-contractor meets the minimum insurance requirements specified above.






