The year 2006 brought a change in leadership to the Racine Police Department. Former Chief of Police David Spenner retired, and the Police and Fire Commission selected me to fill the subsequent vacancy. I appreciate their vote of confidence, and it is a great privilege for me to represent the men and women of the Racine Police Department as their Chief of Police.

My family has roots in this community, and I chose to return here and pursue a career with the Racine Police Department after graduating from college. I began my career with the Department in January of 1977; and since then, I have served the Department in a variety of positions as I moved up through the ranks. It is my hope that my experience within the Department and my familiarity with the community will help me to lead and direct the Department into the future.

There are three important areas that I intend to build upon during my tenure as Chief of Police. The first is integrity. I define integrity simply as doing the right thing for the right reasons, regardless of who is watching. It is my intention to promote integrity in decision making within the Department and to create a climate where members seek after the good of our Department and profession by conducting themselves with integrity and challenging those who are not.

Second, life is all about people and our accomplishments are secured through relationships with others. This is true internally within the Department, as well externally with the community. It is my intention to provide the members of the Department with an environment where they are able to enjoy their work and are given opportunities for input concerning the operation and direction of the Department. It is my expectation that the members of the Department will, in a like fashion, build relationships with members of our community and work together to improve life in the City of Racine.

Third, all too often the police department, like any other government agency or large private enterprise, is focused upon the work process rather than achieving results. We need to be concerned about results and achieving our goals – not about adhering to a lengthy bureaucratic process that may never get us where we want to go. Therefore, we will frequently need to rethink how we get our work accomplished, so that we can more readily attain our goals. Meanwhile, we must not lose sight of our professional integrity and need for community support.

We must strive to work both effectively and efficiently, because the statistics for 2006 clearly reflect that crime is on the rise. We are facing a substantial increase in aggravated assaults and increases in Part I and Part II crimes, in general, while at the same time we are under tight budgetary constraints. Although this situation may test us, I know that we have what it takes to meet the challenge.
