NARRATIVE

On 5/20/22, I, Sgt Juan Garcia, responded to Center St and Carroll St in reference to assisting during a traffic stop with an officer involved shooting. Upon arrival, I directed officers to start securing the scene with crime tape to prevent citizens from entering the area. I observed Officer Brenner, who was directly involved in the incident, being escorted into a squad vehicle. I briefly attempted to read Officer Brenner the Public Safety Statement but he advised it was already read to him.

I then made contact with Sgt. Comstock who requested I go to the traffic stop scene and manage

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that. I made contact with K9 Officer Arvai who was standing by the mentioned vehicle. Sgt Comstock requested we attempt to locate any identifying documents for the suspect. I assisted with searching the glove box while Officer Arvai searched the center console which are two common areas to locate identifying documents. I did not locate any in the glove box and observed Officer Arvai searching the center console. Inside the center console, I could see a plastic baggie with an off-white chunky substance believed to be crack cocaine. The baggie was left in the center console.

I then assisted with maintaining scene security as small groups began forming at different intersections but did not cause any issues. I was then released from my assignment to begin another assignment for the Crowd Control Team.

I would later respond back to the area to assist with crowd control issues which were not observed by myself. This concluded my involvement with this incident.

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On 05/20/2022, at approximately 1301 hours, I was working in the Traffic Bureau when I heard what I thought was Officer (OFC) ZACHARY BRENNER call out that he was chasing someone and shots were fired. Traffic Investigator (TI) MICHAEL DITSCHHEIT and I immediately grabbed our gear and got into marked squad R-3 and responded to the area of Center Street and Carroll Street. While we were en route, Sergeant (SGT) RYAN COMSTOCK advised that he needed squads at that intersection to assist with crowd control. Upon arrival, TI DITSCHHEIT and I noted OFC LAVONTAY FENDERSON was actively stringing crime scene tape across Carroll Street. TI DITSCHHEIT and I then expanded the crime scene zone by stringing crime scene tape along Center Street, completely blocking all of Carroll Street and the open field to the immediate south of Carroll Street. After putting up the crime scene tape, TI DITSCHHEIT and I noted that there were several residents of the apartment building on the north side of Carroll Street that were out in the yard. Many of the residents were walking back and forth, east and west, on the south side of the apartment building, so we positioned ourselves on Carroll Street, immediately adjacent to the apartment building to ensure that the residents of the apartment building stayed on the property. We stayed at this location for quite some time, until we were advised by SGT COMSTOCK that more assistance was needed at Ascension All Saints Hospital, as a crowd was gathering there.

Upon being relieved from our position on Carroll Street, TI DITSCHHEIT and I responded to the emergency room area of Ascension All Saints Hospital. By the time we arrived there, numerous Officers were already on scene and we were advised by Lieutenant (LT) WALTER POWELL that the crowd which had formed at the hospital had already departed. LT POWELL advised TI DITSCHHEIT and I that we were no longer needed at the hospital. At that point, we went back in service to assist with taking calls for service. That concluded my role in this incident.

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SUMMARY

On 05/20/2022, I was contacted, while off duty, about an Officer Involved Shooting that occurred in the area of 12th Street and Schiller Street. I was further advised that the Officer Involved Shooting involved a Racine Police Officer and the suspect was believed to be deceased. I know, based on my training and experience, that an outside agency would be required to investigate the shooting, but that additional tasks would need to be performed by Racine Police Department Officers due to the gravity of this type of incident. I then responded into the Police Department as part of my duties as the Lieutenant of the General Investigations Unit and a member of the SWAT Team.

My Body Worn Camera was activated during a portion of my involvement in this case.

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NARRATIVE

On 05/20/2022, at approximately 1318 hours, I received a phone call from Sergeant (SGT) ROBERT ORTIZ, who was on duty as the Sergeant of the General Investigations Unit. SGT ORTIZ advised that we just had an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS) in the area of 12th Street and Schiller Street and the Officer involved was C.O.P. Officer (OFC) ZACHARY BRENNER. SGT ORTIZ further advised that the party that had been shot by OFC BRENNER was deceased. I know, based on my training and experience, that OIS that result in the death of a suspect, require an outside agency to investigate. I also know that these types of incidents require a large workforce due to the gravity of the incident. I advised SGT ORTIZ that I would be responded to the Racine Police Department (RAPD) to assist in the investigation/administrative tasks.

Upon my arrival, I met with Deputy Chief (DC) RICHARD TOELLER, who was in command of the

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incident. DC TOELLER informed me that he was working on contacting outside agencies to see who would be responding to investigate the OIS. DC TOELLER requested that I have Criminalist TODD HOOVER take overall photographs of OFC BRENNER, who was at RAPD in the second floor lounge, to show his condition and what equipment he was wearing during the incident.

I had Criminalist HOOVER respond to RAPD, at which time OFC BRENNER was brought to the ID Unit where overall photographs were taken. At this time, none of OFC BRENNER's equipment was removed, examined, or taken from him.

A short time later, I was advised via a phone call from DC TOELLER, who was now at the Command Post in the area of 12th Street and Schiller Street where the incident occurred, that DCI would be responding from Madison and they were to head the investigation. I was requested to have photographs taken of OFC BRENNER's pistol, the magazine inside his pistol, the two magazines that he carried on his person, and all of his ammunition. I was also requested to take this equipment from OFC BRENNER, have it secured in an evidence vault, and then re-issue him a new pistol, new pistol magazines, and duty ammunition.

OFC BRENNER was then brought from the second floor lounge, back into the ID Bureau, along with his WPPA rep and RAPD RPA rep, OFC WILLIAM BURINDA. Also in the ID Bureau with me were Criminalist HOOVER, Lieutenant (LT) EDWARD IDE, and SGT JEFFREY BEBOW. During this portion, our Body Worn Cameras were activated. Criminalist HOOVER again took photographs of OFC BRENNER while he was in uniform and asked him to remove his duty belt. Criminalist HOOVER then took photographs of OFC BRENNER's duty belt, OFC BRENNER's pistol, the magazine in OFC BRENNER's pistol, and the single 9mm round in the chamber. It should be noted that OFC BRENNER's duty weapon is a Glock 17 9mm pistol. The serial number was photographed by Criminalist HOOVER. I then counted the rounds that were in the magazine that was inserted in OFC BRENNER's pistol. I counted a total of [REDACTED] rounds of 9mm ammunition in his pistol. Those [REDACTED] rounds, along with the single round of ammunition that was chambered in his pistol, made [REDACTED] rounds in his firearm.

Criminalist HOOVER then removed the two magazines that were in OFC BRENNER's outer carrier. These were the only two additional magazines OFC BRENNER had on his person. The magazines were photographed and then I counted each round in both magazines. In magazine #1, I counted a total of [REDACTED] 9mm rounds, which is [REDACTED] capacity. In magazine #2, I counted a total of [REDACTED] rounds, which is [REDACTED] capacity for this magazine.

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Every round of ammunition was counted again and verified by SGT BEBOW. SGT BEBOW told me he had the same round counts as I had, which again were [REDACTED] in OFC BRENNER's holstered pistol, [REDACTED] in magazine #1, and [REDACTED] in magazine #2.

SGT BEBOW and I then loaded up three new magazines with Federal Premium 9mm rounds of ammunition and these magazines were issued to OFC BRENNER, along with a new Glock 17 9mm pistol, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Once OFC BRENNER was issued his new pistol and three new magazines topped off with 9mm ammunition, I turned my Body Worn Camera off.

Criminalist HOOVER locked up OFC BRENNER's pistol, magazines, and rounds of ammunition into the ID Bureau evidence vault so that DCI could take custody of this equipment at a later time.

I did not remove any additional equipment or examine any other pieces of OFC BRENNER's equipment at this time. This was done at the request of DCI.

Once this process was complete, OFC BRENNER was requested to go with LT IDE and SGT BEBOW, along with representation, to a clinic to complete a legal blood draw. This is standard procedure in OIS investigations.

This concluded my involvement in OFC BRENNER's OIS investigation.

I then moved on to my secondary assignment, which was to dress for the SWAT Team in case civil unrest broke out due to the OIS incident.

During the course of this investigation, I learned that the suspect in this case was DASHONTAY KING and that he was driving a rented 2021 Gray Volkswagen Atlas. This information was significant to me because the evening before, between the hours of 17:30 and 21:30 hours, the Violent Crime Task Force, along with several members of the second shift detective bureau, were on a special assignment to curb gun violence. Part of that assignment was to look for this vehicle as we knew that SIU had received information that the occupants of the rented VW were armed with firearms. SIU OFC S KELAND had a signed search warrant for the vehicle so if we were to locate it, we were going to stop it and execute the search warrant. My team (SGT ORTIZ, INV RASMUSSEN, INV KLEPEL, INV SMETANA, INV MITCHELL, INV SCARVERS, INV ZINNEN, and myself) did not locate the vehicle that night. This is the same vehicle that OFC BRENNER stopped on 05/20/22 that led to the OIS.

On 5/20/22 at approximately 0115 hours I was notified that an officer involved shooting had occurred near 12th St and Schiller St. I made the area which was already secured by numerous officers to see if further assistance was needed. I made the area of Carrol St and Center St and walked east on Carrol St and observed other officers setting up a tent to protect evidence from the incident in a field to the south of 1120 Center St. I did not observe the items in the field. I spoke with SGT ORTIZ who gave me a brief of what he knew about the incident. I was told that OFC BRENNER had initiated a traffic stop in the area of 12th St and Schiller St and the suspect vehicle had pulled into a driveway to the south of the field and an occupant fled on foot, identified as DASHONTAY KING, and he displayed a handgun which resulted in OFC BRENNER firing is duty weapon at the suspect and striking the suspect. I was notified life saving measures were attempted, KING was transported to Ascension All Saints hospital and was deceased. I was then asked to respond to the hospital as it had been reported a crowd was gathering there.

INV CARSON and I made All Saints ER to assist. A small gathering of people (approximately 10 -20) were outside the ER entrance and eventually dispersed. I was told I was no longer needed at the hospital by SGT PETTIS and made RAPD. At RAPD SGT ORTIZ advised I was free to go home.

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NARRATIVE

I, Investigator (INV) TONYA SCARVERS, was part of the aftermath of the traffic stop that occurred at 12th Street and Schiller Street. Prior to my arrival on the scene, I observed what I believed to be our target vehicle being a Volkswagen Atlas gray in color with tinted windows heading eastbound on Washington Avenue approaching 12th Street and taking a left and heading east. I was unable to get the license plate off of the vehicle but had knowledge of the concern with the vehicle from the night before.

On 05/19/2022, I, INV SCARVERS, along with the Violent Crime Task Force Supervisors and Investigators conducted an operation where the Volkswagen Atlas in question was a target. We were unable to locate that said vehicle and continued on with our operation. The next day, being 05/20/2022, is when I observed the vehicle go past me in an opposite direction on Washington Avenue but was unable to get the license plate of the vehicle. Upon returning back on Washington Avenue eastbound I, INV SCARVERS, began to hear radio transmission from Officer (OFC) ZACHARY BRENNER involving that same Volkswagen Atlas truck in a traffic stop. The radio transmission from OFC BRENNER was that he was conducting a traffic stop at 12th Street and Schiller Street, that the vehicle had pulled into a driveway, and the party was running. I then recall the transmission coming over is that a party had been shot and that OFC BRENNER was asking for Rescue and gave out his location of Carroll Street.

Upon my arrival at 12th Street and Schiller Street, I parked my vehicle just west of 908 12th Street and observed the gray Volkswagen Atlas with the driver's side door open and I could hear a party yelling up over the embankment onto Carroll Street. I then went into the yard next door to 908 12th Street and climbed over the embankment and up the hill to assist in what was happening on Carroll Street.

Upon my arrival on Carroll Street, I observed OFC RACHEL TREDO and OFC MATTHEW JOHNSON giving [REDACTED] to a male black party. They were switching off with their efforts to give lifesaving measures. OFC BRENNER was already speaking with Deputy Chief RICHARD TOELLER. I retrieved a paper bag from one of the squad cars with assistance from another Officer to put the male black's belongings in which I believed to be a lighter and cash and no ID. Rescue responded to the scene and took over lifesaving measures and transported the male black, later identified as DASHONTAY KING, to the hospital.

Upon my arrival at the hospital, medical staff was just calling the time of death and the male black was transported to a separate part of the ER where it was less congested with other patients. OFC TREDO stood by while the body laid at rest in the room. Efforts were still being made to identify who the male black was. I received a call from INV KEVIN KLINKHAMMER to confirm whether or not the male black had a tattoo of "yolo" tattooed on his neck. I confirmed with INV CHRISTOPHER BLACKMORE who checked and confirmed that yes indeed he had that and the attempts to make

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positive identification of being DASHONTAY KING was becoming more positive.

I continued to stand watch at St. Mary's ER checking with different groups of what would be needed and observed several people outside of the hospital, inside the vestibule, and inside the ER very upset, yelling, and wanting answers. Two females in particular who claimed to be KING's sisters, one being [REDACTED] and another female black were brought back to the family room where they refused to go in for fear of past experiences in the room while Lieutenant WALTER POWELL spoke with them reference what was going on at the hospital. He advised both ladies that he was not on the scene, could not give any information of what was going on, but that the doctor needed to speak with them reference KING. The ER doctor who assisted in aiding medical treatment to KING advised both ladies what had occurred medically and then they became very loud, boisterous, and were escorted out of the ER back to the very upset and angry crowd. At times the crowd outside the ER had swollen to approximately 30-40 people but no incident occurred from the groups' gathering.

After DCI and four Milwaukee Police Department Investigators finally responded to the ER to investigate the incident, we were released from the hospital by the Racine County Sheriff's Department who stood guard on the body and also the perimeter of the hospital. It should be noted that I on the scene of Carroll Street gave the belongings of KING to OFC JOHNSON to handle.

Once back at the Racine Police Department I spoke with Sergeant (SGT) ROBERT ORTIZ who advised that they had been receiving and monitoring social media accounts with the assistance of CHELSEY BARKER the Crime Analysis party and there was possibly a protest amidst. I advised that I could stay a bit longer and do recon on the city to see if there were groups gathering. Myself, SGT ORTIZ, INV ALICIA MITCHELL, and a few others went out to drive around the city to observe if there was going to be any civil unrest. At the time that we spent out there, there was not any issues or concerns and that ended the night.
