Main Street is going to be closed to vehicle and pedestrian traffic due to roadway construction starting Monday April 21st, 2025. The limits of the road construction are from Goold Street to Melvin Ave. However, the Melvin Ave and Goold Street intersections will remain open at all times, as they are not affected by the construction. The roadway reconstruction will take place in phases.

The section from Goold to Augusta will be completely closed to traffic and completely reconstructed first. This section will be completed by June 21st and then the roadway will be opened again to allow for the Lighthouse Run and 4th of July festivities. The detour for this phase will be the similar to all the construction phases and will utilize Melvin Ave., Erie Street and Goold Street to get around the construction.

Starting Monday July 7th construction on the next phase will begin. The section from Augusta to Melvin will be constructed in two separate phases. The first phase of this section will reconstruct the western portion of the road, but it will allow for one lane of northbound traffic. Once this section of roadway construction is completed, they will then switch construction to the remaining eastern portion of the road. During this phase, northbound traffic will be detoured, and one lane of southbound traffic will be allowed. The northern portion of the roadway is projected to be completed by the end of October 2025.

There will be no parking allowed on N. Main Street during construction operations within the project limits and access to driveways will also be limited. However, alternate side parking restrictions will be waived within a two block radius of the construction area. Augusta, Wolff and William Streets will have limited access also depending on the construction phase and direction of allowed traffic. Any special access needs will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Special handicap parking can also be made available if needed.
